**There are people who have never heard of Jutta Hipp. She was a cool jazz icon in post-war Germany and conquered the Frankfurt jazz festivals in the 1950s – until jazz impresario Leonard Feather brought her to the USA and to sessions with Horace Silver, Zoot Sims and Mingus.**

**This box provides a complete overview of this versatile artist, including Jutta Hipp’s relevant recordings and featuring a collection of paintings, drawings and cartoons as well as letters and poems. The phases in her life – from post-war Germany to her new home in New York – are illustrated with a cornucopia of private pictures, art school sketches, paintings and interviews.**

It's a very delicate... New York with its vibrant jazz scene is a very important element for John Hogg through his contacts in America. He is determined to continue to work in the American scene, pursuing major projects and recordings. In these few years after their first meeting at the Festival, the American scene has become the step, the journey that he has planned himself along his way back to Europe.

His first record, "New Faces... New Sounds From Germany" had reached the American charts in February 1960, introducing John Hogg to "the new face in America's jazz heaven" - it is high time for him to continue his work.
